

Two Initiatives for Evangelization in our ACC

When I was ordained, I followed the custom of choosing a Scripture verse for the invitations that is also chosen as a sort of theme for each priest's hopes for

ministry. I selected Philippians 3:10: "I wish to know Christ and the power flowing from his resurrection; likewise to know how to share in his sufferings by being formed into the pattern of his death."

There is enormous depth to St. Paul's words. But note how the passage begins: I wish to know Christ. This is the goal of evangelization: to help each person we encounter to both experience that longing ("I wish ...") and that Person ("to know Christ").

This "knowing" is not abstract theology or history. It is a personal relationship with the One who calls us "friends." Like any meaningful friendship, it will go through stages and endures through times of both joy and sorrow, in extraordinary moments and in the routines of life.

Evangelization is the very essence of the Church's purpose. Jesus told the Eleven: "Go into the whole world and make disciples of every nation." Finding the best ways to do this in all the changes of place and time means it is never finished, and never simple.

I want to draw your attention and ask your prayers and support for two new evangelization efforts in our One in Christ Area Catholic Community that will be unfolding in the coming months.

First is Young Life. While Young Life began as a Christian ministry that was not originally Catholic, there is a long history of involvement with the Diocese of Saint Cloud, most notably the annual Castaway retreat for youth during Lent and some early youth ministry efforts some decades ago.

You may remember hearing of the "Going, Going, Gone" nationwide survey of young people and faith; among the many striking findings was that youth report "disaffiliation" (the individual choice not to associate with a formal religious group) happens on average around the age of 13, in the middle school ages. Young Life works to form and empower believers to reach out, befriend, and accompany youth at this period of life when they are exploring their personal faith lives.

Bishop Patrick worked with this in his parish in Portland before he became our bishop, so he is very supportive of our piloting the Catholic outreach of Young Life. Again, watch for much more information about how our parishes can become agents of evangelization and welcome for those who are searching for what Christ brings.

Second is the project of the National Community of Catechetical Leaders called "Parents and Families at the Center of Faith Formation." This is a fully grant-funded effort that is "designed to explore how to strengthen faith transmission at home in the first two decades of life and create parish communities that intentionally accompany parents and the whole family." Rather than a faith formation "program," this is a project to develop an approach that best meets the diverse needs of different families and demands. Again, much more will be communicated on this work.

As you read this, please join me in praying – and praying over – Philippians 3:10: "I wish to know Christ and the power flowing from his resurrection; likewise to know how to share in his sufferings by being formed into the pattern of his death."

As you may recall, each of our One in Christ ACC parishes retains its own Pastoral Council, with at least one member of each parish council also serving on the joint ACC Pastoral Council. The ACC Council discerns common goals for the whole ACC, and the individual Pastoral Councils determine how to implement those common goals in their own parish communities, along with attending to their own specific parish needs and programs. As many parishes do, we will follow a discernment process modeled on that described in the Acts of the Apostles. On the weekends of June 1-2 and June 8-9, slips of paper and pencils will be in the pews for parishioners to nominate any confirmed member of Sacred Heart for consideration to serve on its Pastoral Council. You may certainly nominate yourself, or anyone else you believe would have the vision, interest, and broad parish and Area Catholic Community perspectives to serve in this way. Those nominated will be contacted to determine if they are willing to serve a three-year term on the Council, which meets quarterly. Those willing to serve will be invited to a discernment evening on June 12, when the work of the Council is more fully described and any questions can be addressed. The names of the potential Council members are placed in a basket and drawn at random at that gathering in the context of prayer to the Holy Spirit. Those whose names are drawn will begin their service on the Council on July 1.
